



Around our Classrooms

In BIR3 we are focusing on using the arrays to efficiently represent and solve worded multiplication problems. Here students are demonstrating their understanding in three different stages. Stage one is concrete or the 'doing' stage, where students physically move objects to explore a concept. Second is pictorial or the 'seeing' stage where images are used to represent objects. The final or the 'abstract' stage is where symbols and numbers are used to model the problem or calculation. We are also practising using appropriate vocabulary (factor \times factor = product) to explain our equations.



HAAS

Welcome back to Term 3! This term brings new classes I will be working with and new learning opportunities. This term in HASS, students will focus on Australia then and now. They will explore Australia's natural and human features, as well as the uniqueness of the Australian continent and its division into states and territories. Students will learn about the lives of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples before European contact, including the diversity of language groups and their deep connection to Country.

In the Upper Primary classes, students will study how people impact the natural environment in Australia and other parts of the world. They will also examine the major characteristics of North America and Europe, including the influence of human activity on the environment. We will delve into the location and key geographical features of various countries in Asia and explore the diverse lifestyles led by people in different Asian countries, examining differences in population, employment, and ways of life.

In Civics and Citizenship, we focus on developing our understanding of democracy, laws, citizens, diversity, and identity. Through personal experiences and familiar contexts, we grasp the concept that democracy is rule by the people. Additionally, we learn about how individuals actively participate in and contribute to their community.
