




The students put great effort and enthusiasm into this task. They really enjoyed the exploration of various possibilities for experiencing a day in the life of their selected adult.





We created our own dugong pictures.






























B4R7

One of our activities was practicing how to draw a bear by watching a tutorial. The students did a great job following the instructions by illustrating their own


