2024 School Card

Eligibility for School Card Assistance is dependent upon the combined family gross income for the 2022/2023 financial year being within the following School Card limits:

School Card does not roll over year after year; you are required to apply each school year. If eligible for School Card the entire 2024 M&S charge of \$262.00 will be paid and a further \$25.00 can be accessed to purchase uniforms or pay for excursions in 2024.

APPLYING S FOR A SCHOOL CARD

All types of School Card applications **are now online.**

You can access the online forms from any device that gets internet, including mobile devices, such as tablets and smart phones, as well as laptops and computers.

Applying online is easy! Simply follow the steps below.

STEP 1 Visit sa.gov.au/education/schoolcard

STEP 2 Select the type of School Card you would like to apply for (for example 'Type A') and follow the prompts.

STEP 3 Complete all mandatory fields.

Please note: you cannot submit your applications.

Please note: you cannot submit your application unless all mandatory fields are complete

STEP 4 Once you have completed a page click on the 'NEXT' button.

STEP 5 Once you have filled out all pages click the 'SUBMIT' button.

Please note: if you exit the form without clicking 'SUBMIT' your details will be lost.

You can save the form, and return to complete it at another time, by clicking on the 'SAVE' button.





Did you move or change phone number?

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Parents are asked to keep the school up to date with contact details, changes of address and telephone numbers, any changes in a student's medical condition, and any change to the student's family situation.

In order for staff to care for your child, it is important we have current details of all contact numbers for parents/caregivers and an emergency contact if parents are unable to be contacted. We also require current information on any medical conditions.

Secondary School in 2025

How to register your interest for secondary school in 2025 Registration is for students in Year 6 who are starting secondary school in 2025.

Families with students enrolled at government primary schools will receive a unique URL (or web address) by email or letter from their primary school at the beginning of Term 2 in the week beginning 29 April. The URL is sent to the person who has legal responsibility for the child and can only be submitted once. Use this URL to access your online registration of interest form and nominate the public secondary school you want your child to attend in 2025. You can nominate up to 3 schools.

Complete and submit the registration of interest form by **Friday 24 May 2024**. Paper forms are available from your primary school if you cannot access the internet.

You will receive an enrolment offer between Wednesday 7 August and Friday 9 August 2024.

The Inspiring Young Women Program

The Inspiring Young Women Program is a fabulous program created by Uni SA, to inform and empower young women in primary schools by offering a range of hands-on creative STEM workshops. I was fortunate enough to gain access to this program which has allowed 12 girls aged 9 to II to attend these sessions. These workshops have been fully funded by the university with lunch and transport included.

On the Thursday the 28th of March the girls attended the first Science workshop: Space Lander. The workshop discussed how NASA scientists built a lander for the Mars Exploration Rover that had to withstand both the heat of entry into the Martian atmosphere and the impact of landing. The students explored the relevant physics and applied these concepts to design and construct in teams, a landing unit capable of protecting delicate research equipment when dropped from ever-increasing elevations. It was great to see the girls working so collaboratively to problem solve, design and create their own landing units.

The students are very excited to attend the remaining workshops:

- Technology Workshop Wednesday 29th May
- Engineering Workshop Thursday 1st August
- Mathematics Workshop Thursday 5th September
- Inspiring Women Graduation -Thursday 22nd of October, Ilam to 2pm.

Design and Technology

What a great start to the term we have had!

Week I consisted of the students being challenged to build the tallest tower out of match sticks and Blutack. We learnt about the strength of triangles and had a go at a world record attempt of stacking match sticks one handed.

Last week, junior primary students moved onto building bridges out of Lego and looked at the ways in which strong structures can be created. Students worked in teams and discussed why the context of the problem is important in problem solving. Students were presented with a scenario of goats being trapped on one side of a canyon and how their farmer could safely reach them. We pondered how the solution would differ if it was a heavy tractor stuck on the other side, or if it was a one-off situation compared to an everyday crossing.

Cams were introduced to our middle year students. Many discussions were had about the types of cams and what functions they would be best used for. Students began cutting out their cam shapes from cardboard and will work towards creating their own automata using a cam system.

Year 6 students are looking at healthy food options and the daily recommended intakes of the food groups. Students will begin planning smoothies


to appease to a young customer which is appealing and also healthy. Students were provided with a parental note around food allergies. We request this be signed and sent back to school as soon as possible.


We look forward to the exciting learning happening in the next few weeks.

Mid Year Transition to School

This year, Swallowcliffe Preschool has around 22 children who will be a part of the mid-year intake in Swallowcliffe School. To support these children in transitioning into their likely Reception classrooms and

school environment, the Preschool and School have worked together to plan some extended transition times and dates for these students.

Transition is aimed to support children in feeling less anxious about school and give them an opportunity to get to know other children and teachers. The visits will specifically focus on relationship building between the school staff, students and the Preschool children.

These transition times will take place in Weeks 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 10 from 12:00pm-12:40pm each Thursday. Families are not required to attend these transition visits, as children will be supported by Preschool staff. Families will receive their child's final classroom placement with their Preschool report in the last week of Term 2.

STARTING PRIMARY SCHOOL

In South Australia, the first year of primary school is called reception.

From 2024, children who turn 5 years old:

- before 1 May can start school in term 1
- between 1 May and 31 October can start school in term 3 (mid-year intake)
- after 31 October can start the next year.

Children who start school at the beginning of the year will complete 4 terms of reception.

Children who start school in a mid-year intake will complete 6 terms of reception.




REGISTER YOUR INTEREST FOR 2024


