2024 School Card

Eligibility for School Card Assistance is dependent upon the combined family gross income for the 2022/2023 financial year being within the following School Card limits:

School Card does not roll over year after year; you are required to apply each school year. If eligible for School Card the entire 2024 M&S charge of \$262.00 will be paid and a further \$25.00 can be accessed to purchase uniforms or pay for excursions in 2024.

Applying online is easy! Simply follow the steps below.

STEP 1 Visit sa.gov.au/education/schoolcard

Select the type of School Card you would like to apply for STEP 2 (for example 'Type A') and follow the prompts.

STEP 3 Complete all mandatory fields.

STEP 4 Once you have completed a page click on the 'NEXT' button.

STEP 5 Once you have filled out all pages click the 'SUBMIT' button.

You can save the form, and return to complete it at another time, by clicking on the 'SAVE' button.





Did you move or change phone number?

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Parents are asked to keep the school up to date with contact details, changes of address and telephone numbers, any changes in a student's medical condition, and any change to the student's family situation.

In order for staff to care for your child, it is important we have current details of all contact numbers for parents/caregivers and an emergency contact if parents are unable to be contacted. We also require current information on any medical conditions.



Preschool

Dear Preschool families,

At Preschool we have been developing our knowledge of blending sounds to make words and rhyming words in our literacy program. We have enjoyed shared reading of the book How to Catch a Star by Oliver Jeffers. The children have explored other space themed experiences such as dressing up as astronauts and exploring our space cave, finding planets hidden around the yard with our space hunt, and enjoying sensory play with space slime. The children have also enjoyed finding and sorting numbers in our sensory tub, imaginative play in our birthday themed home corner, cutting and gluing activities making rockets, painting, dance parties and visiting the school library.

Children have been enjoying our Kids in the Kitchen program. In Week 7, we cooked Veggie Nuggets and the children really enjoyed chopping up the vegetables, using the food processor and rolling the mixture into nugget shapes ready for the oven. In Week 10, we will be making damper as part of our celebration of NAIDOC Week. Our Kids in the Kitchen program is run entirely on donations from families; without these donations, we cannot conduct this program. Coming up in Week 10, we will be having a Preschool Pls Day on Monday 1st July for group 1 and Tuesday 2nd July for group 2. Children can come dressed in their comfy PJs to Preschool. On Thursday 4th July we will have our Preschool Graduation Party to celebrate the children leaving to go to school.

THE NEW MID-YEAR INTAKE TO RECEPTION **STARTS IN 2024.**



STARTING PRIMARY SCHOOL

In South Australia, the first year of primary school is called reception.

From 2024, children who turn 5 years old:

- before 1 May can start school in term 1
- between 1 May and 31 October can start school in term 3 (mid-year intake)
- after 31 October can start the next year

Children who start school at the beginning of the year will complete 4 terms of reception.

Children who start school in a mid-year intake will complete 6 terms of reception.



Registrations of interest are now open to start school in the 2024 mid-year intake.



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

Minister's Letter

Dear parent/caregiver

At a time when the cost of living pressures are being felt by many families, the South Australian Government is acting to deliver financial relief towards the cost of public education.

We want to reduce financial stress for families as much as we can.

That is why, as part of the 2024-25 State Budget, families with school-aged children will receive a \$200 discount per child on their public school's Materials and Services Charge for 2025 – double the discount amount provided for 2022, 2023 and 2024.

You don't need to do anything to claim the discount – it will automatically be applied by your school.

The discount does not apply to families approved for the School Card scheme as these families are not required to pay a Materials and Services Charge.

We hope this increased discount will provide some relief.
